GARRISON WHEAT

Garrison is a hard red winter wheat variety released by Oklahoma State University in 2011. The primary area of adaptation for Garrison is western and central Oklahoma and central Kansas. Garrison is an excellent dual-purpose variety (grazing and grain production) and has very good straw strength.. Yield potential of Garrison is excellent and it offers a fairly good disease resistance package and tolerance to acid soils. Garrison is one of the few varieties to maintain its resistance to stripe rust with the race change in 2011.
