SANTA FE WHEAT

Santa Fe is a hard red winter variety developed by WestBred® and licensed to AGSECO. Santa Fe is moderately susceptible to stripe rust and moderately resistant to leaf rust. It has excellent overall leaf health. Its excellent yield potential and disease resistance make it one of the top variety selections for central and eastern Kansas and Oklahoma. Santa Fe also offers exceptional grazing potential. Santa Fe has dominated the State Performance Tests in recent years, and may be planted on any soil type in the eastern 1/2 of Kansas with the expectation of top performance.
